2. Legal basis

We process personal data in accordance with the applicable data protection regulations, in particular, the GDPR and the German Data Protection Act (Bundesdatenschutzgesetz, BDSG).

3. Processing purposes and recipients

- 3.1. In the context of cooperation with business partners (dispatch of information material, access control of visitors, processing of orders, preparation of offers or provision of services, etc.), we process personal data pursuant to Article 6(1)(b) GDPR for the performance of a contract or the implementation of pre-contractual measures:
 - business contact information such as names, addresses, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses, etc.,
 - payment data.
 - data from publicly available sources, and
 - other data whose processing is necessary for the performance of the contractual relationship.
- 3.2. Further processing of personal data may take place if you have granted your consent to do so (Article 6(1)(a) GDPR). You can revoke such consent at any time and informally with effect for the future. In addition, processing will be carried out if this is required for the fulfilment of legal obligations (c) or the protection of legitimate interests (f).
- 3.3. We process personal data for the following purposes:
 - communication with business partners,
 - initiation and processing of contractual relationships,
 - implementation of promotional activities, insofar as you have consented to this,
 - compliance with legal or regulatory requirements, contractual obligations and our policies to ensure compliance requirements (f), and
 - investigating and processing claims concerning legal disputes (f).
- 3.4. We will only transmit personal data to third parties if this is permissible and necessary in line with lawful processing, for example, to associate companies within the scope of orders and deliveries (e.g., third-party deal). We will only transmit data to third countries outside the EU if the requirements for this according to Article 44 et seq. GDPR are met.

4. Duration of data storage

- 4.1. We store your data and corresponding documents for the duration of the provision of the service and/or in accordance with the respective statutory retention periods.
- 4.2. After the end of the service provision or expiry of the statutory retention periods or when statutory deletion periods are reached, the data and documents will be deleted.

5. Rights and contact details

- 5.1. If the legal requirements are met, you shall be entitled to the following rights at any time:
 - right of confirmation and right of access (Article 15 GDPR),
 - right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR),
 - right to erasure (Article 17 GDPR),
 - right to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR),
 - right to data portability (Article 20 GDPR),
 - right to object (Article 21 GDPR),
 - right to withdraw any data protection-related consent (Article 7(3) GDPR) as well as
 - right not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing, including profiling (Article 22 GDPR).

If you wish to exercise one of these rights, please contact the data controller or the data protection officer (see Paragraph 5.2).

5.2. Furthermore, you have a right to appeal (Article 77 GDPR). Accordingly, if you have any concerns, questions or a complaint, you have the possibility to contact the data controller,
